In spring and summer months, set your ceiling fans to turn in the counterclockwise direction. This will create a cool breeze. Remember: Ceiling fans cool people, not rooms. Turn them off when you leave the room.

The motto of Operation Round Up® is “small change changes lives.” This is a fantastic motto for a program that truly transforms lives by using small change collected from the members/owners of Four County EMC. The program works by members voluntarily rounding up their power bill to the next dollar. For example, if a member’s power bill is \$150.60 then the bill would be rounded up to \$151.00 and the additional \$0.40 goes into a fund called Operation Round Up®. The money that is “rounded up” is used to provide assistance to cooperative members in crisis situations and non-profit organizations serving the Four County EMC area.

This program has truly changed people’s lives over the course of its twenty-four years.

“Working with Operation Round Up® really makes you appreciate the important things in life such as

There have been several situations where families lost everything in a house fire or flood and Operation Round Up® was there to provide them the means to buy new clothes and food to help them in their time of need. Several local

non-profit organizations have received blessings from Operation Round Up®—food pantries, fire departments and Special Olympics.

It is nothing short of amazing to see the way this program transforms our communities for the better. All of these things are only possible with the strong support from the members of Four County EMC that elect to round their bill up each month.

## HVAC/Heating and Cooling System Financing Available to Qualifying Members

Four County offers a variable rate loan called "The Comfort Loan" to qualifying members to assist in upgrading or replacing their old heating and cooling system with a NEW high efficiency heat pump. Also, the Comfort Loan program makes funding available for insulation. This program gives mem-

bers a cost-effective way to make improvements to their home by using low-interest funding.

With the summer months soon approaching, now is a good time to take action to ensure your home will provide and maintain comfort in an efficient manner.

### What items can be financed through the comfort loan program?

- Insulation
- Replacement of existing heating and/or cooling system(s) with all-electric high-efficiency heat pump or central air conditioning unit

### How much money is available through the comfort loan and what are the interest rates?

- Maximum amount for an all-electric high-efficiency (14 SEER) heat pump or central air conditioning unit is \$6,500 at 6% interest.

- Maximum amount for an all-electric high-efficiency (15 SEER) heat pump or central air conditioning unit is \$6,500 at 5% interest.
- Maximum amount for an all-electric high-efficiency (16 SEER or higher) heat pump or central air conditioning unit is \$6,500 at 4% interest.

### Save with Rebates

Heat pump rebates are available for any member that installs a 16 SEER or greater heat pump. This applies to new construction or retrofits. The rebate is \$100 per ton. Proof of purchase is required in order to receive the rebate.

## Bright Ideas

EDUCATION GRANTS

Do you have an idea for an innovative classroom project? Here at Four County EMC, April marks the official kickoff of the Bright Ideas education grant program. The Bright Ideas grant program is offered by all 26 of North Carolina's electric cooperatives and supports educators in need of funding to implement creative, hands-on learning projects. NC Teachers in K-12 classrooms are encouraged to apply for a grant of up to \$2,000.

As a member-owned cooperative, Four County EMC is committed to supporting local communities, and last year, Four County EMC awarded \$19,860 in Bright Ideas funding to local teachers. Since 1994, educators statewide have received more than \$11.5 million in Bright Ideas grant funding, and well over 2.2 million North Carolina students have participated in approximately 11,000 Bright Ideas projects.

Grant applications will be accepted beginning Sunday, April 1 through Sept. 28. It could pay to apply early: all teachers who submit their applications by the early bird deadline of Wednesday, Aug. 15 will be entered into a drawing for one of five \$100 Visa gift cards.

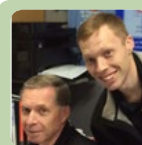
